Course description

What are the structural constraints on the genesis, evolution and practice of India's foreign policy since independence? How can we highlight integral linkages between the 'domestic' and the 'international' aspects of India's foreign policy by stressing on the shifts in its domestic identity and the corresponding changes at the international level? The course on "India's Foreign Policy in a Globalising World" will focus on India's shifting identity as a postcolonial state to the contemporary dynamics of becoming an 'aspiring global power'; India's evolving relations with the superpowers during the Cold War and after; bargaining strategy and positioning in international economic governance and India's neighbourhood policy including trends after 2014.
